Including you in the arts

The arts are great at

- understanding what makes us different from each other
- understanding what we have in common with each other

We want the arts in Wales to include everyone.

We know that the arts in Wales will be more exciting and fun if everyone is included.

To help make this happen we are going to make sure that **equality** is always at the centre of our work.

Equality means that everyone is treated fairly and equally.

What is an Equality Plan?

To make sure we always treat people equally we have made an **Equality Plan**.



An **Equality Plan** is a plan that says what we will do to make sure we do not **discriminate** against people.

Discrimination is when you are treated worse than other people for some reason.

About discrimination

You can be discriminated against because of your

Disability - because you have a physical disability, a sensory disability, a learning disability, or mental illness

Age - because you are too young or too old

Gender - because you are a woman, or because you are a man

Religion - because of what you believe or do not believe

Race - because of the colour of your skin or where you were born

Pregnancy - because you are expecting a baby

Marriage and Civil Partnership - because you are married

Gender Re-assignment - because you have changed your sex

Sexual orientation - because you are heterosexual, lesbian, gay or bisexual

Heterosexual, lesbian, gay and bisexual

Heterosexual means a man who is attracted to women or a woman who is attracted to men.

Lesbian means a woman who is attracted to other women.

Gay means a man who is attracted to other men.

Bisexual means people who are attracted to women and men.

You could be discriminated against for more than one reason.



For example, because of your disability and your age.

What we are going to do to make the arts in Wales more equal

We have identified 16 things that we will do to



get more people to enjoy the arts in Wales



make sure we treat people equally

We will:

- 1. Make sure we give money to more different kinds of arts
- 2. Make sure that the organisations we give money to treat people equally
- 3. Promote training about equality to organisations we give money to
- 4. Make sure that projects that make the arts more equal and help people understand each other have a better chance of getting money from us
- 5. Share examples of projects that have helped to make people more equal or helped people understand each other better
- **6.** Make sure all the information we produce is easy for people to access and understand
- 7. Share information about what's going on in the arts and how people can get involved

- 8. Get people to talk with us and each other about the things we can all do to make sure people are more equal. We will start by making the Creative Case for Diversity the subject of our next conference
- 9. Give people in the arts a guide to treating everyone equally
- Make sure a wider range of people come and work at the Arts Council of Wales
- 11. Train our staff and trustees about equality
- 12. Check that we are doing what we say we will do
- 13. Make sure we treat everyone equally when we buy the things we need
- 14. Make sure that the people who work for us get paid the money that is fair

- 15. Make sure we always have good information about people who can be discriminated against. Use this information to help us improve our work in the future
- 16. Work with other organisations and people who can help us understand the views of people who can be discriminated against

We will look at this Equality Plan every year to make sure we are doing the things we have said we will do.

If we find that we should be doing things differently we will make changes to the Equality Plan.

We will tell you about how we are doing in our Annual Equality Report.

We will put this on our website. You can also ask us for a paper copy.
