

Venue Access

Yukon Arts Centre



The main entrance to Yukon Arts Centre has double doors which open onto the sidewalk level, which has a slope for access from the parking area in front of it.

The Lobby is spacious, which accessible washrooms and drinking fountains, no automatic doors, but level entrances into the back stage and mini gallery.



There is a mezzanine level which is only accessible by stairway, with hand railings on either side up. This leads to an open space and doorways to the upper level of seating to the main theatre.



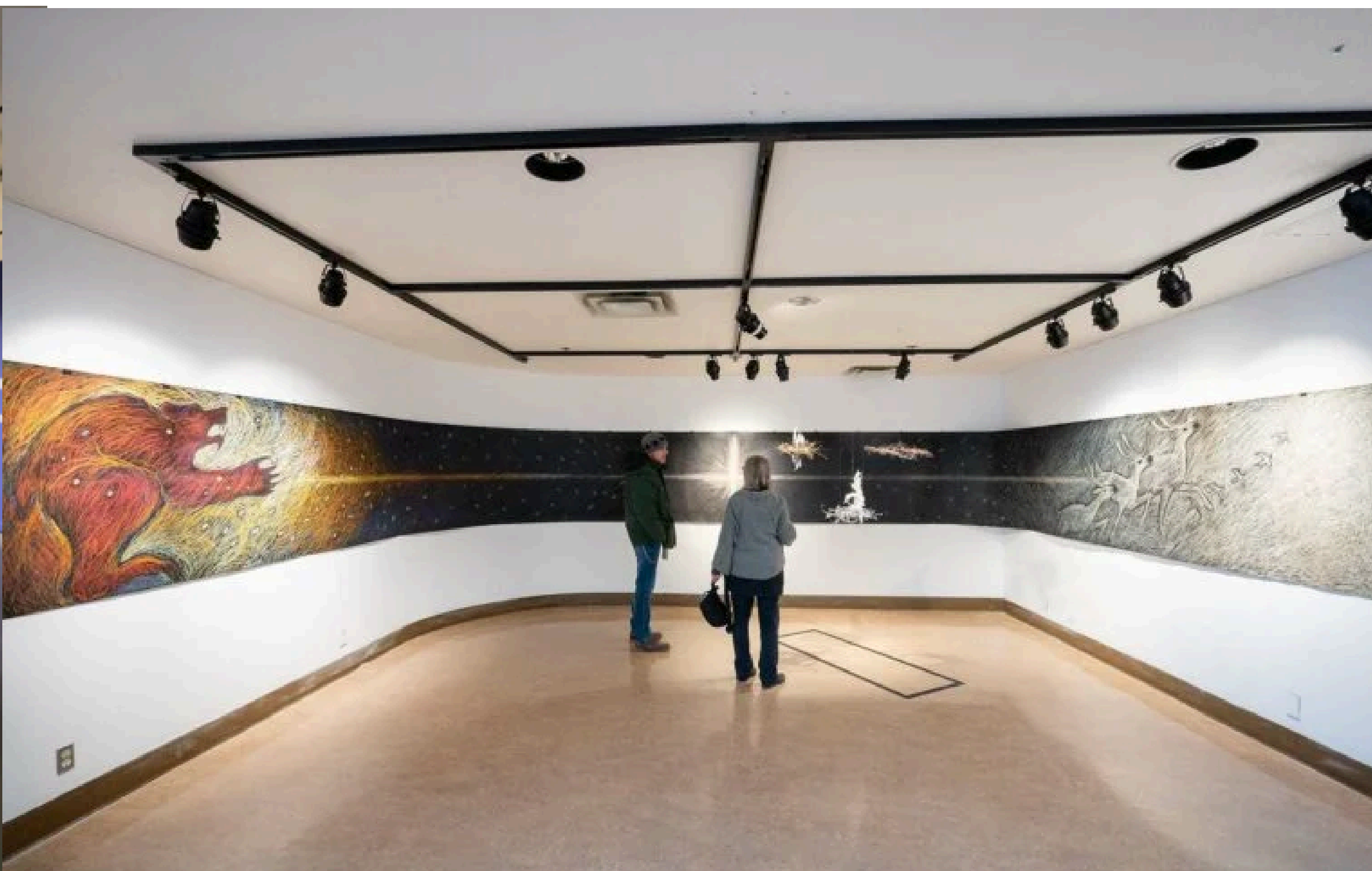

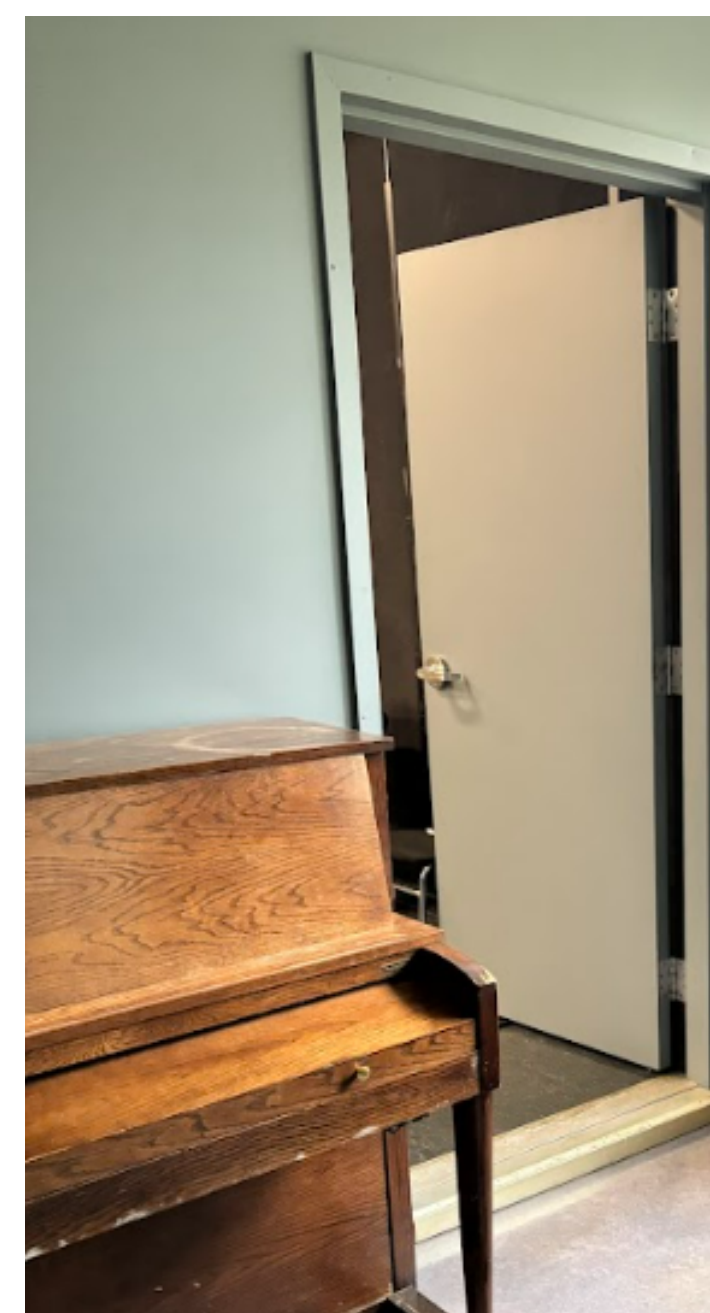


The Main Theatre of the Yukon Arts Center has a reserved elevated zone for wheelchair users to see the stage, and access to the stage itself via backstage doors. The seats are at descending levels accessible by elongated steps with short distance in height, and hand railings all the way down, as well as hand railings along the stairs up to the stage.

The Yukon Arts Centre Mainstage is fully equipped with a hearing assist device. Devices that work with existing hearing aids are also available.



The Main Gallery space is all on one level, same as the lobby, with access via double glass doors but no automatic button to open. The Mini Gallery is an offshoot from the lobby with no glass doors or stairs at all, seen above to the right.



The Studio Theatre is accessed through a single width door, down a hallway.
